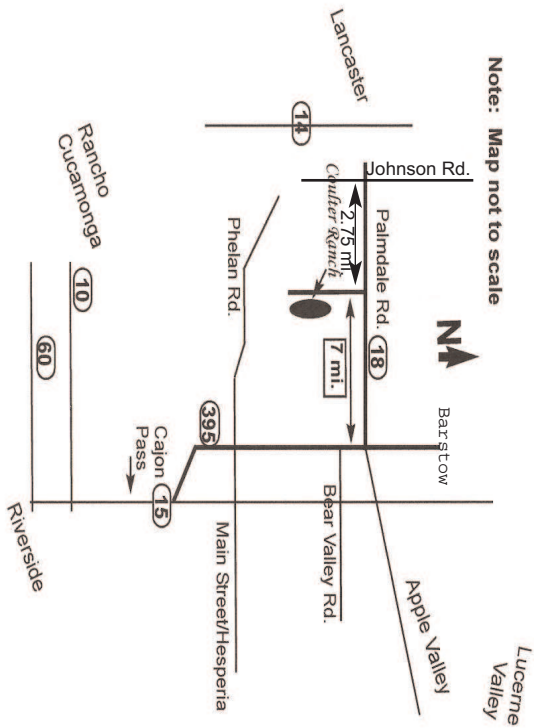

Interstate #15 North: Exit onto Highway #395 North, proceed to Palmdale Rd. (Hwy. #18) West. Set odometer to 0. At 6.8 miles, begin looking on your left for a large white/blue sign, "Coulter Ranch". Turn left on La Mirada, and proceed to first ranch on your left. Look for parking signs.

From Highway #18 (Palmdale Rd.) West: Set odometer to 0 at Hwy. #395; follow directions above from #18 and #395.

From Highway #18 (Palmdale Rd.) East: Set odometer at 0 at Johnson Rd; at 2.75 mi. turn right on La Mirada.

Horse Show Rules

Knowledge of and compliance with the rules of USEF and CDS is the responsibility of the exhibitor, rider, driver and handler as well as the competition management and officials. For a thorough and complete understanding of the rules, refer to the USEF Rule Book (current edition) and the updates published in USEF News and CDS Dressage Letters. The Show Standards published on pages 20-26 apply to all CDS shows, and competitors are responsible for familiarizing themselves with those rules.

1. All competition arenas will be the standard (20 x 60 meter) measurement.
2. Current USEF and USDF tests will be used.
3. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
4. Show management reserves the right to arrange for additional judges and to cancel, combine or amend any class, including but not limited to class awards, scheduling and location.
5. Show management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, without claim to damages.
6. Show management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incidental to the show, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered by these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Show Management and such determinations shall be final.
7. Owner/Agent/Participant agrees that every horse entered, or which they bring to the show grounds, will be subject to the rules of the Horse Show management. However, Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur to any horse entered or on the grounds, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the USEF, the United States Dressage Federation, the California Dressage Society, any additional recognizing organizations, the horse show facility, the horse show and its management and employees and volunteers for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur.
8. All Owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents, employees or animals to stall buildings and other properties on the show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. All bills for veterinary, farrier services and feed are due and payable during the show. The management reserves the right to deduct any unpaid veterinary, farrier and feed bills from premium, stake or prize money, or refunds due the exhibitor. Any exhibitor not meeting obligations to the official veterinarian, farrier or feed supplier will be termed an undesirable exhibitor and entries from that exhibitor may not be accepted at subsequent shows.

Horse Show Rules (Continued)

9. Owner/Agent/Participant agrees that if stabling is provided, show management is merely providing stabling for the convenience of the participant and management and sponsoring organizations shall have no responsibility whatsoever for any injury, loss, damage, etc., as a result of using said stabling. Owner/Agent/Participant agrees to indemnify, defend, & hold Show Management, their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers & affiliated organizations harmless from any loss, damage or claims as a result of said use. Owner/Agent/Participant/ Exhibitor/ Rider assumes all care, custody, and control with regard to this use.
10. Entries close and must be received by the closing date. Classes are filled on a first come, first served basis. Entries close when classes are filled. After that time we will accept entries on a waiting list basis to fill scratches, if any. No refunds after the closing date. A \$25 fee will be charged on any check returned by the bank. Entries are not considered complete until all signatures are complete, memberships are verified and payment is complete. Numbers will not be issued until entries are complete and all fees are paid.
11. All juniors must wear properly fitting protective headgear passing or surpassing current applicable ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials) / SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards with harness secured while riding anywhere on the Show grounds. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must be immediately prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.
12. Horses may compete in no more than one Recognized Competition on the same day(s) and are limited to a maximum of three Dressage rides per day at Fourth Level and below or two Dressage rides per day above Fourth Level. Dressage Seat Equitation and Materiale classes are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition.
13. It is the responsibility of the competitor to call Show management to determine if the show is cancelled in the event of rain. The show will be held as long as the footing is determined safe.
14. Individuals are eligible as Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21. Competitors shall compete as Adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22. Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as Adult Amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22.
15. Each competitor (rider) is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers for horse and owner. Photocopies of all cards should be included with the signed entry blanks.
